In 2002 the Conference for Food Protection (CFP) entered into a cooperative agreement with the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) to provide independent third-party evaluation and accreditation of certification bodies determined to be in conformance with the CFP's **Standards for Accreditation of Food Protection Manager Certification Programs**.

The FDA in a **Memorandum of Understanding** recognizes the Conference for Food Protection (CFP) as a voluntary national organization qualified to develop standards to promote food protection. The FDA encourages agencies of government to accept certificates issued by listed certifiers as meeting their jurisdiction's food safety knowledge and certification requirements. The American National Standards Institute (ANSI) has independently evaluated these certification programs under an agreement with the Conference for Food Protection.

The State of Georgia Department of Human Resources, Environmental Health Section recognizes the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) as an accrediting organization. (ANSI), as a recognized accrediting organization for personnel certification in food safety, is a source to meet Certified Food Safety Manager (CFSM) certification requirements as noted in the 2007 version of the Georgia Food Service Rules and Regulations Chapter 290-5-14.
